

Admissions at a Glance

Apply online at clemson.edu/admissions or via the new Coalition Application at coalitionforcollegeaccess.org.

Application fee: \$70

- Apply by December 1 and receive a decision the week of February 15. Applicants are automatically reviewed for merit-based academic scholarships.*
- Housing priority is based on the date of the student's application submission.
- Criteria considered in the decision process:
 - Class standing
 - Standardized test scores (ACT or SAT**, no writing score required)
 - High school curriculum
 - Grades
 - Choice of major

* Please note that students who wish to be considered for Clemson's National Scholars scholarship program are required to apply for admission to the Calhoun Honors College no later than December 8.

** If you submit old SAT scores (from tests administered before March 2016), Clemson will convert the old SAT decision scores (critical reading/math/writing) into new SAT sections (evidence-based reading and writing/math). The overall total SAT score will then be derived by taking the highest of the evidence-based reading and writing/math scores. For ACT scores, the best composite score will be taken.

Deadlines

December 1: Last day to submit your application for priority notification.

December 31: Due date for official high school transcripts and standardized test scores for priority notification.

February 15: Admission decisions mailed.

March 1: Deadline to submit the FAFSA for need-based programs, loans and grants.

May 1: Final deadline to apply for fall admission.

Financial Aid

Financial Aid is usually awarded on the basis of need to supplement the amount students and their parents can contribute to college expenses. Scholarship criteria and amounts for 2017-18 are subject to change. clemson.edu/finaid

Merit-Based Academic Scholarships

South Carolina Residents

Students who ranked in the top 10 percent of their class and had an SAT score of 1270+ or an ACT score of 27 have typically been competitive for one or more of these awards.

Out-Of-State Residents

Students who ranked in the top 10 percent of their class and had an SAT score of 1320+ or an ACT score of 28+ have typically been competitive for one or more of these awards.

Transferring to Clemson

Transfer students need to complete 30 semester hours of transferable credit and earn a 2.5 GPA (on a 4.0 scale). Students should also complete all freshman level courses in English, science and mathematics for their intended major.

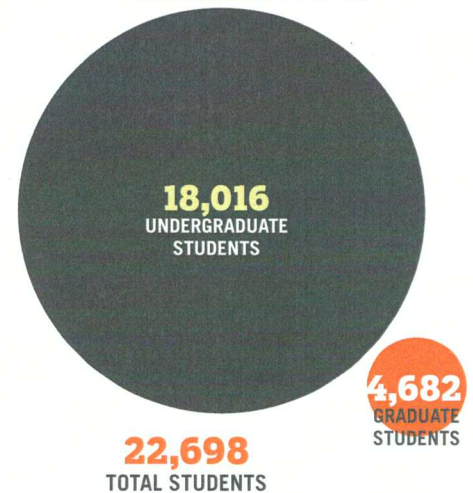
